ACCOUNTABILITIES

Pursuant to OH's business unit Clinical Accountability Framework and in support of OH's Vision and Mission and the Ontario Cancer Plan, the Provincial Head, PSO will guide OH's efforts in improving care for all people of Ontario. This leadership role has direct accountability to the Vice President, Clinical Programs and Quality Initiatives. Accountabilities for this role include:

- Provide visionary clinical leadership for PSO at the provincial level
- Advise on a strategic vision and goals for the program and engage PSO stakeholders in the cancer quality agenda. This includes driving the advancement of provincial initiatives in partnership with the regional partners.
- Provide oversight to PSO Regional Leads
- Identify and respond to system-level issues related to PSO
- Work closely with regional stakeholders on the uptake and use of PSO-focused evidence
- Provide scientific direction for the PSO measurement strategy (system and regional performance) and advise on priorities within the measurement plan. In particular, provide clinical direction to inform methods to measure access to and quality of PSO services.

- Provide clinical leadership on the development, implementation and concordance of PSO guidelines and strategic documents (e.g. PSO Service Delivery Framework, Oncology Caregiver Support Framework, OH clinical guidance on depression, exercise and sexual health).
- Provide clinical direction on strategic initiatives and projects, including PSO system capacity planning and work to integrate funding for PSO across cancer system funding models
- Work collaboratively with other Provincial Heads and Clinical Leads to support cross-program initiatives and to address common goals related to safe, effective, high quality, person-centred care
- Participate as a member of OH's Clinical Council
- Provide clinical and administrative leadership for regional meetings (e.g. quarterly performance reviews)
- Establish and maintain effective links with relevant clinical communities and other key stakeholders such as funding agencies, research bodies and patient and family advisors on behalf of OH
- Contribute to the development and implementation of the Ontario Cancer Plan

QUALIFICATIONS

- A PSO practitioner (e.g., social worker, psychologist, psychiatrist, dietitian, occupational therapist, physiotherapist, or speech-language pathologist, etc.) recognized as a leader in Ontario or nationally
- Clinical, research and/or academic experience in the area of PSO
- Proven track record of clinical leadership within health care and/or academic institutions
- Knowledge of clinical, administrative and system issues with respect to cancer services
- Strong professional presence and ability to present to large and small audiences in a concise, articulate and dynamic fashion
- Demonstrated commitment to person-centred care and public accountability
- Enthusiasm for, and commitment to, quality improvement in cancer care at the system level
