POSITION SUMMARY

Ontario Health is seeking expressions of interest from clinicians with established expertise in pediatric genetics for the position of **Clinical Lead, Pediatric Genetics Expert Group**.

Ontario Health has established a Provincial Genetics Program (PGP) to ensure the provision of comprehensive, coordinated, evidence-based genetic services for Ontarians. This program will provide oversight and administration for comprehensive genetic services for the people of Ontario, including genetic testing for rare and inherited disease, hereditary cancer, tumour biomarkers, and clinical genetic services.

The Provincial Genetics Program currently has established Expert Groups focusing on Neurogenetics, Neurodevelopmental Disorders, Cardiogenetics, Inborn Errors of Immunity, Renal Genetics, and Reproductive Genetics. Under the strategic direction of the Provincial Head – Provincial Genetics Program and the Provincial Genetics Advisory Committee (PGAC), the Clinical Lead, Pediatric Genetics, will bring clinical, research, and quality improvement leadership expertise in the subspecialty area of general pediatric genetics conditions that are out-of-scope for other Expert Groups. This is a unique opportunity to provide leadership to the evolution of the Ontario health system as we work to drive quality, accountability, and innovation. This opportunity is open to all qualified candidates.

ACCOUNTABILITIES

The key responsibilities of this position are:

1. **Horizon and Jurisdictional Scanning:** Ensuring Ontario's health system is aware of and prepared for emerging genetics knowledge and practice. Identifying and understanding differences in policy and practice between Ontario and other key jurisdictions.
2. **System Performance and Quality Monitoring:** Lead the development and maintenance of quality indicators and quality initiatives where applicable. Regular attendance and participation at select Ontario Health Clinical Leads committees.
3. **Development of Evidence-Based Guidance:** Ensuring priority topics for clinical/laboratory guidance are identified and that high-quality guidance is developed and kept current.
4. **Inquiries:** Upon request, serve as a spokesperson and provide timely advice on specific issues in response to requests from government, media, the public, the Ontario Ombudsman, Ontario Health programs, and others.
5. **Alignment:** Ensuring alignment of Ontario Health's efforts have an impact on issues related to the pediatric patient population. Participating in select committees and providing updates to Ontario Health.
6. **Engagement:** Ensuring multi-disciplinary and multi-stakeholder engagement in the above work. Establishing and maintaining a link with stakeholders within Ontario Health and provincially within a broad group of stakeholders involved in the provision and delivery of genetic services for this patient population, including an Adult Genetics Expert Group.

Specific accountabilities and priorities of the Clinical Lead, Pediatric Genetics are:

- Serve as Chair of a Genetics Expert group with a specialized focus in pediatric general genetics. The Pediatric Genetics Expert Group will advise on genetic testing, clinical genetic services, and management for pediatric patients including, but not limited to, those with rare syndromes affecting multiple systems and inherited conditions of the hematologic, respiratory, endocrine, ophthalmologic, and audiology systems.
- Oversee the development and implementation of the Pediatric Genetics Expert Group workplan and ensure that schedule and scope are maintained.
- Provide advice and leadership to Ontario Health, the Pathology and Laboratory Medicine Program, and the Ontario Health Out-of-Country Program on evidence supporting new genes, implementation of new genetic tests, and technologies that could impact lab services.
- Identify, track, and ameliorate relevant risks.
- Meet with the PGP and Executive Sponsor, as required, to understand the status of the initiative and to respond to any escalated issues.
- Advocate and promote the goals and activities of the Expert Group as required across the province:
 - Bring forward to leadership relevant issues from the stakeholder community and as a result of environmental scanning.
 - Champion the project through various mediums including presentations to key stakeholders.
 - Respond to media queries as requested by Ontario Health.
- Act as a liaison between Ontario Health and the genetics lab community, clinical services, research, and academia in Ontario, nationally, and internationally.
- Report on the progress of initiatives as required.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Clinician and/or clinician-scientist with significant expertise and focused practice in Pediatric Genetics. Qualified candidates may include:
 - **Clinical geneticist**, MD or equivalent with certification in medical genetics or clinical biochemical genetics. Requires certification by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (FRCPC) in Medical Genetics and Genomics, the Canadian College of Medical Geneticists (FCCMG) in Clinical Genetics or Clinical Biochemical Genetics or equivalent international certification.
 - Licensed to practice in Ontario in good standing with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario (CPSO).
- Five to seven years of clinical experience in pediatric general genetics.
- Experience in a leadership role focused on quality and system improvement.
- Recognized as an opinion leader within the genetics community.
- In-depth understanding of Ontario's health care system, with particular focus on the challenges and issues related to the delivery of genetic medicine.
- Expert knowledge of current best practices, healthcare literature, and evidence-based guidelines, as it pertains to pediatric general genetics.
- Knowledge of health system performance measurement and management approaches, and how this can be used as a tool to promote change.
- Aptitude for system thinking and ability to analyse information for sound decision-making.
- Demonstrated commitment to equitable and person-centred care, as well as public accountability.
- Excellent communication skills with mature leadership experience in establishing strong relationships and building consensus.
- Demonstrated experience in implementation of large-scale change in the health sector.
- Demonstrated ability to work with diverse stakeholders to reach consensus.
